

Pastor's Letter

"Why do you look for the living among the dead?" That, according to Luke's gospel, is the question the two men in white asked the women who came to the tomb that first Easter morning. The women supposed that they would find a body that they could anoint and prepare properly, giving due respect to the dead. But there isn't a body. Instead there are messengers telling them to look toward the future. All has changed. Life will be different from this time forward.

It took a while for the women and the other disciples to understand fully what that meant. Jesus was no longer with them in the flesh but they were empowered to go out and preach and teach in his name.

Living centuries later we still need to hear and understand the challenge of those words. We have a tendency to keep looking back at how things have been, how things were done, the way things used to be. There is value in history to be sure. But time moves forward. We need to look for where there is life and vitality. That is where we look for Jesus. In the church this is a particular challenge for us. There are old hymns and habits that are comforting and comfortable. BUT, they no longer help us tell the story of God's love to a new generation. Of course we are to find and give comfort in the church. However, our primary task, after worshipping God, is to go out into the world to tell others about God's love. That means we need to look at our forms of worship and music, our communications and programs and see what will not only support the present members but reach out to bring others into our fellowship.

Many of you may remember the strip film projector. We used to use that and flannel boards a lot in Sunday school. Now we know we need power point, social media thru i-phones and tablets to reach into the world. Songs that we remember make little sense to younger generations. "The way we've always done this" will no longer work. Our challenge is to look at each activity we do and consider whether it is the best way to proclaim the gospel. For proclamation in word and deed is our prime task. Perhaps dinners and suppers used to be a way to invite people in. Now we may need to consider barbeques, family movie nights or early evening activities.

Change is the order of the day. Our challenge is to discern what God's will is for ourselves and for Trinity church. As we continue to plan for a new pastor, may we also plan for how we look for Christ among the living and develop ways to make the Good News available to more and more people in our world. Let us rejoice that Christ lives. He is risen indeed!

Income \$6,547.96

Expenses 10,601.45

Difference (\$4,053.49)



As you see, our expenses for February were more than our income. We did have to draw from our investments to help us with that deficit amount. We will probably have to do that every month of 2016.

This may sound bad to some of you, but for the month we expected a deficit of -4,455.74. We were better than our projections. For the year we projected a deficit of -\$8,330.03 but we only have a deficit of -3,217.23 for the first two months of 2016.

Each month I give a copy of the financials to the office. I urge any of you to request a copy from Lynne and take a look at how your pledges are coming in and also to see our monthly expenses. Take a look at it by category to see what it takes for us to enjoy our church and its programs. Maybe you have some ideas that may help us. Your input is greatly appreciated. 

Change In the 2 Cents a Meal Collection




Featured Speaker...Dr. Phillip Hall


