My Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Most of us have a morning routine that helps us to shake off the grogginess of sleep and to give us the energy to face a new day. Perhaps that routine involves drinking a cup or two of coffee, eating a delicious breakfast, reading a newspaper (or at least checking our news app), perhaps a workout and a shower. Whatever we do, we each must face a new morning of waking up, shaking off sleep and set about living in a new day. Just as one must wake-up every morning, so too do we as Christians have our wake-up moments. Every morning, we must shake off sleep and start about living in that day. As Christians, we have our wake-up moments in Jesus Christ when we come to a greater understanding of ourselves and the world around us.

In the gospel of Luke, the prodigal son had spent all his money on wasteful living. While tending pigs, starving and missing home, the text says, *he came to himself*. The spiritual alarm clock is going off and he had a wake-up moment. He began a time of introspection noticing the consequences of his actions. He was the one who led himself into the mess he found himself in. The choice to demand his inheritance and spend it wastefully was his. His choices in life led him away from home and into the far country, tending another's pigs, while his father's hired hands had more than enough food. He was the one who hurt his family. He was the one who ran away. He at long last began to see himself clearly; he at long last began to see and to understand. He had a moment of "waking up"

This is our moment to wake-up. This is our moment to come to ourselves. Lent is a time of introspection when we cooperate with the work of the Spirit of Jesus Christ. One of the workings of the Spirit is to reveal ourselves to ourselves, or to put it more simply, to wake us up. What if the Spirit is leading us to look at the consequences of our actions and inactions and to take responsibility for them and to own them? What if the Spirit is enabling us to see the broken condition of our lives and to work with Christ as the repairer of our brokenness? What if the Spirit is helping us to see that we are the ones who ran away from God, and to walk the path needed to go back? What if the Spirit is working to save us, not just from devils and demons, but what if the Spirit is trying to save us from ourselves?

The Word from our Lord is that now is the time to wake up! Now is the time to come to ourselves. Now is the time to cooperate with the Spirit to accept the consequences of our actions and our words, to hold ourselves accountable for the traumas we have created. Now is the time to cooperate with the Spirit and to repair the breaches in our lives, to make peace with those we conflict with, to forgive and ask for forgiveness, to bless others with our words, to build up instead of tearing down. Now is the time of the Spirit of Jesus Christ to work and now is the time to cooperate in and with that work, with faith and obedience.

My friends, as we begin our preparations for Holy Week, we need to have a sense of urgency. A sense that now is the time to be the prodigal sons and daughters that we are; through the Holy Spirit to see ourselves as the ones who ran away from God. Through the work of the Holy Spirit, now is the time to wake up and run back. Let this be our new routines, drinking from the Spirit, feasting on the Word, and living for our God. Now is the time to wake-up!




