

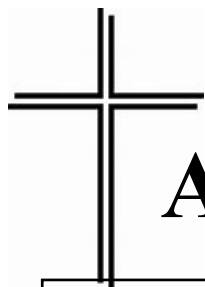

## **FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK**

My Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

The beauty of the Erector Sets from my childhood is that the same pieces can be put together in many ways and each time the result is unique. In one session, the parts become a plane. In another session, the pieces become a car. In another session, the parts can even become something that has never been created for. The same parts, but they can be shaped into different forms and shapes, only limited by the hands and imagination of the builder.

The beauty of Easter is that the same people created by God can be resurrected and put together in new ways as part of the New Creation. By defeating sin and death in raising Jesus, God has taken away the nature that continually “misses the mark” or “falls short” and instead creates a new nature, the very nature of Jesus Himself. The same people, but made new, only limited by the work and imagination of Jesus’ Spirit.

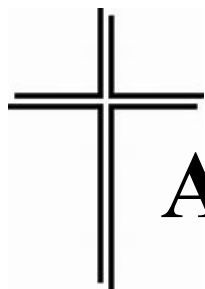
Revealed in Jesus Christ, we see that humanity still carries the same identity in our resurrection as we had before. The resurrected Jesus still looks like the crucified Jesus, marks, scars, and holes. Jesus was not abandoned, nor forsaken, but delivered from sin and death. But the resurrected Jesus is the same Jesus as before and it will be the same for us. Resurrection yes, but the same us as now will be the same us then. We will not be abandoned nor forsaken but delivered from sin and death. The same us now, and the same us then.

But while we see revealed in Jesus Christ, that the same identity is carried over, Jesus becomes new. He could walk through walls, disappear, hide himself from people’s awareness and shine with the Glory of God. The same Jesus but resurrected or transfigured or transcended from before; and it will be the same for us. The same us, but glorified, covered with covenant faithfulness, filled with the Glory of God and putting on life without ends. To be resurrected is to be the same in identity but transcendent in nature.

The Easter journey of Jesus’ Church is one of metamorphosis which quite literally means form-change: the same parts recreated into a resurrected creation. Our journey this Easter is also one of metamorphosis, as we find ourselves on the cusp of merging. We certainly can relate and understand that to be resurrected is to become new, because this Easter could very well be the last in the form of Trinity and East Side Presbyterian Churches. But to be Resurrection people, means that all things can become new. But it is still the same us because it is the same Jesus. We have not been abandoned nor forsaken, we have been resurrected. The same people, the same identity, the same community, but resurrected into the new creation, in a new form.

This means we can take comfort in the knowledge that even though Jesus was changed on Easter, he was the same Jesus as before. If he was the same in identity, so will it be for us. Even though things have changed, we are still the chosen, beloved and called Children of God. But this also means that we can take challenge in the knowledge that even though Jesus was the same on Easter and on the cross, he was a different Jesus than before. Even though we are the same Covenant family of God, we are still the being resurrected Children of God. So, this Easter, let us remember that we are still the covenant community of God in whatever form we look like. But let us also remember that to be the covenant community of God means a continual metamorphosis or form-change. We are God’s Erector Set, the same pieces, a new creation. Let us live into God’s covenant family; the same us, a new form, whatever shape and appearance God is resurrecting us to become. Amen.

Session met March 19th and the normal business was carried out including:

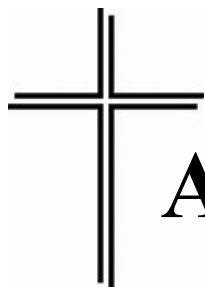
- Approval of minutes from February session meeting.

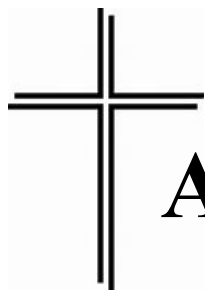
## **REPORT FROM EAST SIDE'S SESSION**

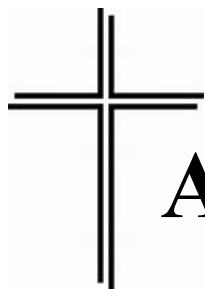
The Scrip program will then be officially terminated. Thanks to all who supported this mission through the years.

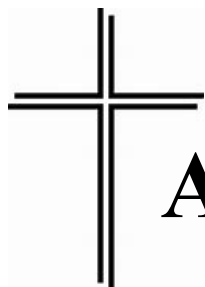

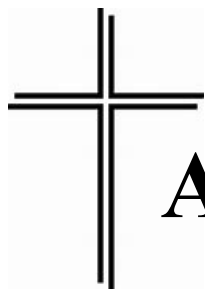
