

In the Constitution of the Presbyterian Church (USA), that is, the Book of Order, the index has six pages listing the responsibilities of session. They include managing all aspects of worship and governing the business of the church.

Book of Order G-3.02 "The session is the council for the congregation. ... The session shall have responsibility for governing the congregation and guiding the witness to the sovereign activity of God in the world, so that the congregation is and becomes a community of faith, hope, love, and witness."

"In light of this charge, the session has responsibility and power to:

provide that the Word of God may be truly preached and heard.

provide that the Sacraments may be rightly administered and received.

nurture the covenant community of disciples of Christ.

Session is to keep minutes of session meetings, congregational meetings and joint meetings with deacons.

Session is to maintain Membership Rolls and registers of baptisms, ruling elders and deacons, and installed pastors. .

The session shall prepare and adopt a budget and determine the distribution of the congregation's benevolences. It shall provide full information to the congregation concerning its decisions in such matters.

We have committees to take care of those responsibilities. Each seated Elder is to be a leader or active participant in at least one committee. Our session is currently composed of 9 elders, three classes of three, each serving three-year terms.

The elders currently serving are:

Ministerial Relations Committee

The Ministerial Relations Committee meets regularly with Mark to discuss any concerns he has and also bring to him any concerns from Church members. We will also be advocates for Mark's leadership in the church and facilitate communication between Mark and the congregation. One of our primary objectives of the committee is to promote healthy dialogue with all involved. While the committee seeks to foster understanding and prevent unnecessary conflict, it may arise. Personnel Committee

The committee also completes the annual performance reviews of staff, recommends any salary changes to session for approval, and address employee concerns.

Nominating Committee

The Nominating Committee is elected at the Annual Congregational Meeting in February.

Responsibilities:

Seeking out and appointing members in good standing to serve as Ruling Elders and Deacons of the Trinity Presbyterian Church

The committee will make every effort to fill vacancies and present them to the Session for approval no later than the regularly scheduled October Session meeting in preparation for election of officers which is held on the final Sunday of October.

A member serving on the Nominating Committee cannot be nominated for a position while serving on the committee. A retiring elder will serve a chairperson of the committee.

Scrip Fund

The Trinity Scrip Program was begun by Jill Huggins. Since then, Sue Karvonen, and Donna Shiflet have been administrators. At this time, Dee Fassett and Mary Belding hold the responsibility of administration.

The Scrip Program provides gift cards through Raise Right (previously Shop with Scrip).

We have a stock of cards most often requested available Sunday morning and by special request. There are over 550 brands available. When cards are requested, they are ordered and delivered within a week. Folks have used gift cards when purchasing large items (lawn mowers, carpet) when able to plan those purchases. In November folks, giving us a long list, purchase gift cards for Christmas gifts.

The rebate that Trinity earns ranges from 1.5%-18%. You purchase a gift card, Trinity gets the rebate. The funds earned are donated to the Trinity Operating budget at the end of the year. Donations from earnings in 2018: \$1200, 2019: \$1800, 2020: \$1000, and 2021: \$1200.

Eden Project

We are the Eden Project – Growing food-growing faith.

Trinity Presbyterian Church is in the tenth year of being stewards of a community garden. The idea of a garden was seeded by a sermon eleven years ago. Melanie Todd was the prime mover in getting the Eden Project started.

The first year with the able assistance of Rees and Meghan Davis, the garden plan was drawn up. The second year we received the gift of eight 4'X16' raised beds. With the help of the Stowell family, Dick LaDu, Brad Luce, Todd McGill, Mary Belding, and Warren Truesdell the beds were moved to our garden site. Todd McGill used his tractor to pull out the hedge on the south line and dug and moved soil to a raised mound on the south west corner.

Paul Savol and two co-workers from Aqua dug a 60' trench and installed a water line and water hydrant. Aqua allowed them to use their equipment. Tools were donated by many. Denny and Carol Rich constructed a compost bin. We purchased soil for the raised beds. Bob Belding brought us more soil to extend our beds. Tony Campbell, Brad Luce, and Terry Karvonen helped with that project.

The work and material contributed saved our fund at least \$5000.

The Eden Project in its first year received financial and advisory support from congregation members, the Presbytery of the Western Reserve, Trinity Womens Association, Card- making Ministry and the Fellowship Committee as well as the Presbyterian Hunger Program.

Sunday school students planted seeds for the first three years that eventually became a bountiful harvest.

Plants have been contributed from ATech and Saybrook Feed. One year Becca Stowell had kids from After School Discovery starting seedlings for us.

Many have contributed time and energy in the garden. In past years, Todd McGill, Brad Luce, Dick and Peg LaDu and Mary Belding have mowed the grass.

Over the years, many people have adopted a bed to plant, weed, and water. They include: Dave and Beth Adams, Nan Adams-Case and Gary Case, Betty Lou and Al Cherry, Dee Fasset, Sue and Terry Karvonen, Dick and Peg LaDu, Ray and Megan Laylin, Brad and Marion Luce, Denny and Carol Rich, Jessie Smith, Becca Stowell, Dee Fassett, Kathy and Dale Fassett, Ruth Allen, Ruth Ann Ayers, Joyce Kren and Mary Belding. Some of our neighbors have also helped out. Many stop to talk to us and express their delight in having a garden in the neighborhood.

We have had gardening and cooking training sessions with After-School Discovery summer programs.

In 2016, we received a donation from Beth and David Adams of two wonderful benches which were installed on the north east corner of the garden. A flower bed was added near the benches to enhance the joy of being able to peacefully enjoy the garden. The benches are still there and still as nice as new. Our Ashtabula neighbors respectfully use them.

For ten summers we have produced a bounty of healthful food which has been made available both to our congregation on Sunday mornings and to the Dream Center. The Dream Center has a soup kitchen at 57th and Washington, supported by Harvest International Church. They supply lunches four days a week throughout the year. They have reported that they use all the food we give them. What isn't used immediately is frozen for later use.

There are many opportunities to assist with this project. Anyone interested in sharing in the stewardship of the Eden Project can Contact Joyce Kren or Mary Belding. If you have a home garden and want to share some of your produce, we will be happy to accept that.

It is a blessing for us to be able to share with our neighbors. Thanks to all who have been and are part of this project.
