Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

We all have been tested. Perhaps those tests have been in mathematics or social studies. Doctors have tested us for high cholesterol and low blood sugar. Even our credit and our arrest records can be tested by our employers. Facebook even offers tests to see if we can remember famous people in the 80's. We have all been tested and we all have at one time or another received a less than perfect "grade" or "score." We all have been tested and we all have missed the mark or fallen short.

Nowhere is this more evident or clear than when God tests us compared to his only Son Jesus Christ our Lord. Nowhere do we miss the mark more than when God compares our faithfulness and obedience to the faithfulness and obedience of Christ. Our loyalty doesn't just match up to Jesus' loyalty, which was loyal even to death on a cross. Our love doesn't compare to Jesus' love, which was willing to spill blood. Our humanity falls short of Jesus' humanity, the only human without sin and with perfect obedience.

But while Jesus' death reveals to us, we all fall short, Jesus' death also reveals how long, deep, wide and high is God's love for us. God was willing to send Jesus to his death: an ugly, unjust and treasonous murder, to reach, find and deliver the murderers (that's us). Such love is this, that Jesus would not just die for his friends, but that Jesus would die for his enemies (that's us) to transform them into his friends. Such love is God's to take us humans who fall short of Jesus and though Jesus to lift us back up to the humanity God wanted us to have. O the Love of God that will not let us go but seize us and lift us back to our rightful place in creation, humans created in God's image.

As disciples of Christ we are on the way to the Kingdom of God, but we are not there yet, and that means daily we fall short of Christ. This means that daily, but more so in Lent, we need to accept the responsibility for our thoughts, misdeeds, actions and inactions. Daily we need forgiveness for sins, sins both done and left undone, and daily we need filled with things Right, Good, and True. This then is faith in Lent, acceptance and acknowledgement of who we are; on the one hand we are sinners who when tested fall short and on the other we are beloved sons and daughters of God for whom the Son of God chose to die to make right.

Perhaps then, we have found at last the perfect "A" for Lent: to see and accept the responsibility for our daily falling short and to acknowledge the Grace of God which covers our errors and fills us with Righteousness. Perhaps Lent is about taking responsibility for "I" and taking his forgiveness and new life God gives, solely because God chooses to give it in love! I encourage you therefore this Lent, to accept responsibility for "I": My thoughts, our words, my actions, and our failures. But also, acknowledge Jesus Christ: I have forgiven you, I have given you my own life. Then, we just might find that as the people of the Spirit of Jesus Christ, we at long last will pass the test of God! For that we say Alleluia! And Thanks be to God!


