My Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Each and every time we take a trip somewhere, we leave something behind. On our trip to Grandmas and Grandpas, we leave behind a comb or toothbrush. On our trip to the zoo, we leave behind sunscreen and sunglasses. On our trip to the grocery store, we leave behind those plastic bags we mean to recycle. Each and every time we go somewhere on a journey, we always leave something behind.

Just as we leave something behind going on a journey to the mall, so too do we leave something behind going on our Christian journey following Jesus Christ. But the things we leave behind are not combs or toothbrushes, sunscreen or sunglasses, or even plastic bags, the things we leave behind to follow Christ are quite different. When Jesus calls Peter to become a fellow fisher of people with him, the scriptures report that when they had brought their boats to shore, they left everything and followed him (Luke 5:11). He had a new career catching people therefore everything in regards to catching fish had to be left behind. He had a new master, therefore everything in regards to his old master had to be left behind. He even had a new family, therefore everything in regards to his old family had to be left behind. In order to begin a new life with Christ, Peter had to leave behind everything regarding the old life behind. He just simply couldn't catch people while he was catching fish.

If we are to enter the new life and the new partnership with Jesus who also calls us to share in his life and ministry, we need to learn to leave behind our old life sitting on the docks. We are called to a new career serving God, therefore we must leave the old career serving ourselves behind. We are called to a new way of life loving and serving God, therefore we must leave the old way of life loving and serving ourselves behind. We are called to be a part of a new family of God, therefore we must leave the old family of the world behind. If we are to enter the new life of Christ, we must learn to leave the old life of sin and death behind.

The reality of our Christian journey is that we are stuck in the space between the old life of the world and the new life of Christ. We have one foot in the world and one foot in Christ. What we spend every moment of every day struggling with is the leaving the world behind and the striving for Christ ahead. We wrestle daily with leaving the old life behind and embracing the new life before us. The good news for us who struggle is that we never struggle by ourselves, we struggle together with Jesus Christ. We never wrestle by ourselves, we never serve by ourselves, we never live by ourselves. Everything we do, we do together with him. Peter was called to be a fisher of people, but good news for Peter, Jesus was right beside him fishing too!

Therefore, let us who struggle with the journey of discipleship take great comfort in the good news that Jesus asks nothing of us which he has not already done and continues to do himself. We do not struggle in a vacuum, we struggle together with He who alone left all of heaven behind to seek the new life ahead. So let us struggle on, and let us entrust ourselves to the care and ministry of our Lord and our Brother who continues to struggle with us each and every day of our lives. If he keeps calling, let us keep following.




