My Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Our world has much to be worried about. Without delving into world or national politics, we still have much to be anxious and fret about. In Ashtabula alone, we could worry about the poverty and addictions we struggle with. Many are wrestling with health issues, and/or dealing with loss. Schools are restructuring, elections are beginning, and worse of all, I worry about getting my grass mowed before my lawn turns into a hay field. We have many things to worry about and many things to be concerned over.

Worry seems to be a fundamental part of out human nature. While our modern world has many technologies, our forebears did not have these assets to increase our standard and length of life. But, while we have these new things, our technology and progress has not been able to remove our worries. In the ancient world, famine was an everyday reality, but while we might be able to change grocery stores when they have no milk, money is still needed to buy groceries. In the ancient world, clothes were made by hand, but while today's malls have 30 clothing stores, one needs credit to purchase them. In the ancient world, doctors and medicine were unreliable at best and con artists at worst, but while we have capable specialists and facilities, insurance and finances are still needed to procure the best medicine. While our world is far better than it was, we still have many an opportunity to worry.

Worry was and is such a problem, Jesus speaks directly to it, do not worry about your life, what you will eat or what you will drink, or about your body, what you will wear. Look at the birds of the air, they neither sow nor reap not gather into barns, and yet your Heavenly Father feeds them. Are you not worth more than they? It is this last verse that strikes us the hardest, Are you not worth more than they? The flowers and birds have all they need from the hand of God; will God not be faithful in caring for you? It is the worried heart that has the Word of God given in the Spirit of Jesus Christ, planted deep within. When the heart becomes worried, it is My friends, we are already recipients of God's Peace which can calm every anxiety we can possibly have. We are ever reminded that God chose as Jesus of Nazareth to baptize us with God's own Peace. If we truly posses this peace, then we have nothing to worry over; because God is faithful. Let us therefore, be calm amid our everyday trials. Let us seek God's Kingdom first and its righteousness. Let us not worry about the things we need. But let us do so, because we trust in our Faithful God to give, instead of trusting instead in what we already have. And we just might find that everything else has already been added unto us.

Financial Report for March 2018

Income: \$8,586.00 Investment withdrawal 10,000.00

Total Income \$18,586.00

Expenses: \$10,046.35

Our actual March loss -1,460.35 Add investment withdrawal 10,000.00

We show a positive amount 8,539.65 which is what is left of that investment withdrawal after paying the March loss.

Hopefully the April income will come closer to the expenses for the month.

So far this year we have withdrawn \$22,000.00 from investments to help with expenses. For 2018, we have budgeted \$47,394.57 to be withdrawn from investments for the operating expenses. Hopefully we can stay within that budget for the rest of 2018.

So far this year we received \$1,245.32 for per capita. Our per capita expense for 2018 is \$3,450.00. Per capita amount is \$30 for each member.
