Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Words are everywhere around us, and not all of them are nice. Many use words as a critique of someone or something, such as politicians criticizing the policies of political rivals. Many use words as a judgment of others, such as posts on social media judging another person's body, belief or political party. Many use words as a label condemning oneself, such as "fat," "stupid," "selfish," "guilty." We human beings find a common thread in our common nature, to critique, to judge and to condemn ourselves and others, regardless of whether they are valid and/or unjust.

Perhaps then we have a closer connection than we at first understood with Christ on Easter Sunday. Easter is many things and has many aspects, but one of today's most important is that on Easter Sunday, God overturned the human critique, judgment and condemnation of Jesus. Humans put Jesus to death under the ultimate criticism, judgment and condemnation. God raised him not only to new, unending life but to the position and post as Lord of the Kingdom of God. The undeserved criticism, the invalid judgment, the unjust condemnation by sinful human beings, is overturned, undone and overwhelmed by the decision and power of Almighty God.

In a world filled and overflowing with harsh words, God's Word is the final and highest Word of Love and Grace. No other Word can be uttered that rivals in power and ability the Word uttered by God as the man Jesus of Nazareth in the power of the Holy Spirit. Humans criticized, condemned and killed. God validates, approves, and revives. Humans spoke to destroy. God speaks to create. Humans attempted to exert power over God, God displays the ultimate and final power over humans, and the consequences of their words and choices. God spoke to make, and no human or demonic power could undo or unmake what God chose to say and do.

This means that because of Jesus, we can move from critique to validation. Because of Jesus, we can move from judgment to forgiveness. Because of Jesus, we can move from condemnation to acceptance. Because of Jesus, we can move from our crucifixions (the ones we do to ourselves and the ones we do to others), to our resurrections, (the one God is doing to us and to others.) Because of Jesus, we can move from sin to Love. Easter has many layers and many levels of meaning for us, but in a world of critique, judgment and condemnation, one seems to be more important in this moment. What humans strive to critique, judge and kill; as Jesus of Nazareth, God validates, accepts, and resurrects.

Perhaps then we need a shift in our attitudes, our behaviors, our priorities, to ourselves and to others. That shift is from the temporary and futile words of humans to the Final and Ultimate Word of God. Perhaps we need a shift from sin and death to Love and Life, in the community of the Spirit of Jesus Christ. Perhaps this is the moment of the first-fruits of your resurrection, where you can begin to leave behind your crucifixion with Christ and with Christ begin to truly live. In the name of Jesus Christ, leave behind your critiques and condemnations and with Christ, enter God's Love and Life!




