Dear Trinity Members,

Please allow me to introduce myself. I'm Rev. June Begany, your new interim pastor. I'm excited to begin my time and work with you. In August I completed an interim at Pioneer Memorial Presbyterian Church in Solon. That was a wonderful experience. TREASURER'S REPORT

For the year 2015:

Total Income \$ 96,082.49 Total Expenses 124,055.00 Deficit for 2015 \$ (27,972.51)

Even though we did end up in a deficit figure for 2015, we did much better than we expected. Our 2015 budget predicted a deficit of \$52,934.46. Our income was more than predicted and our expenses were less than predicted. Good job Trinity family. We will run a deficit budget each year as long as our pledged income is less than our expenses. Expenses on the 2016 budget are at their bare minimum. Our budget for 2016 shows a predicted deficit of (\$49,532.28). Hopefully we can overcome that.

Don't forget that the per capita this year is \$28.00 per member. When you become a member of any Presbyterian church, you also become a member of the Presbyterian Church U.S.A. The per capita are the dues paid by each member to PCUSA. Trinity Church is billed for every member each year for those dues. In 2015 less than half of our current members paid their per capita. Let us try to do better this year. It is a privilege to be a member of the Presbyterian Church U.S.A.



Your Pastor Nominating Committee (PNC)

Trinity's "Fantastic Seven" are beginning to review the PIF's of various individuals working together around the common goal of identifying who God is calling to serve our congregation. Time is necessary to fully review every PIF, making sure decisions are made with the best interest of everyone involved. Below is a short explanation of our work and process. **The Church Leadership Connection (CLC)**

The Church Leadership Connection (CLC) is the Internet-based matching and referral system of the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.).

The Ministry Information Form (MIF)

Presbyterian congregations, presbyteries, synods, educational institutions, and other Presbyterian entities seeking leaders for ministry positions fill out a Ministry Information Form (MIF). This form describes the size and make-up of the congregation, the type of community where the ministry is located, the position to be filled and the salary for the position. Answers to narrative questions describe the ministry and mission of the church in more detail. Once completed the MIF is submitted to CLC and following approval is posted in the CLC system.

The Personal Information Form (PIF)

Presbyterian pastors, Christian educators, administrators, executives and other church professionals seeking a call to service within the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.) fill out a Personal Information Form (PIF). This form lists the person's education, work experience, ecclesiastical standing, and any professional memberships and certifications. It also lists the types of positions the person is interested in serving along with minimum compensation they will consider. Leadership Competencies and interests are listed along with narrative answers to several questions. Once completed the PIF is submitted to Church Leadership Connection (CLC) and following approval is posted in the CLC system.

Matching MIFs and PIFs

Once a MIF is posted in the CLC system, matching the MIF with PIFs in CLC can be done. Matching selects PIFs that fit most closely to a particular MIF in position type, years of experience, salary, and leadership competencies. The list of referred PIFs is sent to the chair of the Pastor Nominating Committee (PNC) or search committee for their discernment. The "list" is forming and we are now entering the review process. Your part in this process is to remember the PNC in your prayers.

The weight of Trinity Presbyterian Church lies on our shoulders. You can be a part of this journey by reflecting on the following:

- 1. OPEN MY EYES... that I may see the people You bring into my path the way You see them." (2 Kings 6:17; Luke 4:18)
- 2. OPEN MY HEART... that I may share Your passion and compassion with them." (Matt. 10:35–38)
- 3. OPEN THE DOOR... that I may have the opportunity to share my testimony and/or the Gospel with them." (Col. 4:3; Acts 1:8)
- 4. OPEN MY MOUTH... that I may boldly, but wisely, make Your message abundantly clear." (Eph. 6:19; Col. 4:4–6)
