FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

My Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

As a young boy I was often spending my free time playing with Legos. For either my birthday or for Christmas, I was given a set and I would spend countless hours building and taking apart. But, I never seemed to have enough to build what I wanted to build. When building an airplane, I didn't have any wings. When building a fire truck, I didn't have any wheels. When building city hall, I didn't have any roof. Needless to say, I was frustrated in my building endeavors to find that I never had enough Lego blocks to build what I wanted to, I was always needing more.

But while I was always looking for more Lego blocks to build what I wanted to build, I always had the perfect number of blocks to build what someone else suggested. I might have been wanting more wing blocks to build my airplane, but I had just enough to build a helicopter. I might have been wanting more wheels to build a fire truck, but I had just enough to build a cop car. I might have been wanting more roof blocks to build city hall, but I had just enough to build a gas station. What I noticed after a while of always needing more to build what I wanted to build, I always had enough to build what someone else had in mind. Instead of Legos being scarce, I already had an abundance of Legos.

So too is it with us. We think there just isn't enough. Our lives just don't have enough time in them to do everything we need to do. Our lives just don't have enough resources to do everything we need to do. Our lives just don't have the energy to do everything we need to do. We need more, and we need to get it before the family next door gets it, because the world just might run out of it. There is only so much good stuff going around and before it runs out, I need to get as much of it as possible, so that I will not run out of it. We live as though everything good in this life is scarce and we had better get it first and store it up for tomorrow.

But what if.... What if we were not always lacking that something whatever it is, but what if we already had an abundance of it? What if we were never missing the Legos we needed to build an airplane because we were supposed to build a helicopter? Instead of things being scarce, what if God has already given us the abundance we need?

Many of today's churches are aging; meaning time, energy and strength are lacking. Many of today's churches are parents; meaning time, energy and strength are lacking. Many of today's church have other priorities; meaning time, energy and strength are lacking. But what if instead of not always lacking those things, what if God has already given us the abundance we need?

The disciples sure thought they didn't have enough when they said to Jesus a few loaves and fish are not going to feed five thousand men besides the women and children. The disciples thought that a year's wages still couldn't feed that many people and they surely didn't have a year's wages and wouldn't give it up if they did. But Jesus wasn't interested in what they didn't have, Jesus wasn't worried about scarcity, Jesus knew his Father and Jesus trusted that his Father already gave him everything he needed abundantly. So Jesus took what he did have and fed thousands of people. What they already had was more than enough to do what God wanted. Jesus didn't deal in scarcity, Jesus dealt with God's abundance.

What if we as Christians didn't deal in scarcity but instead dealt in abundance? What if instead of worrying about how we don't have people in the pews, or money in the checking account, or a leaky roof that we can't fix, what if we dealt in what we do have? Abundant gifts freely given of the Spirit of Jesus Christ to do the work of God, prepared for us, instead of the work we prepare for ourselves. What if instead of worrying about not being able to make an airplane with what we don't have, we instead build the helicopter with everything God has already abundantly given. Let us deal in God's abundance instead of the world's scarcity!


